Dear Friends,

When we gathered on Ash Wednesday to begin this season of Lent, and when had the ashes of last year's palm branches imposed on our foreheads, we had no idea of the Lent we were about to experience. Yes, we knew that Lent is a season of self-denial and sacrifice, of confession and repentance, but we had no way of anticipating the degree of sacrifice we would face this year!

The early church often practiced fasting during Lent as a means to turn their focus back to God and to God's gift of Jesus. Some folks continue to practice fasting, but most of us only give up something symbolic: chocolate, watching TV, alcohol. Some of us succeed for the entire 40 days; many of us do not.

This year it's different. Many of us have been forced to fast like we never thought possible; we have had to give up going out to dinner at all, gathering with family and friends, going to work, going to school, going to the gym, going to the movies, going to sporting events, even going to worship at our church. More seriously, others have had to give up their income; going to visit parents, siblings, and spouses who are in health care facilities; their daily meals that they received at school; their sense of safety and security.

Still others have given up their health and even their lives. In my 68 years of life, I have never experienced a Lent that was anything like this one.

Often, when I officiate at a church member's funeral during Lent, I will say something like "Easter came early for (name of the deceased) this year." I talk about how their suffering and dying has been their "Lent" and how the release from their broken bodies is their Easter as they have now experience resurrection into the glorious kingdom of God.

This year, it looks like for most of us, Easter will come *late*. Yes, we will purpose to celebrate Easter this year in spite of social distancing and staying at home, and to be sure, even during Lent, we never lose sight of Easter. But however we celebrate on April 12, I suspect that for many of us, we will still be in Lent. This year, Lent looks to continue for more than 40 days.

Yet my hope, my confidence, that Easter is absolutely coming—whether in May, or June, or July—is firm; it is sure! Because the real victory of Easter, Jesus's death on the cross and his resurrection three days later, is already a reality! It is finished! It is done! The victory is won!

True, we are living in between the victory of Easter and the physical reality of that victory for our world. Evil is still alive and well on planet earth. We have not yet come to the fateful day when "at the name of Jesus every knee will bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father," but I believe in God's promise that day is coming!

GOD'S PROMISE IS GOOD NEWS!

When everyone bows to Jesus and makes Jesus Lord of their lives, then the victory over evil is forever a reality!!! It will be that day when every one of us will say and really mean it: I want to let go of all that holds me back, I want to live as a child of God!

Our perfect relationship with God and with each other will be restored. **God will wipe away every tear** from our eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain or coronavirus!!! Everyone can truly LOVE God and each other, and there is no fear in LOVE! It is not a day of punishment or judgment to be feared, as some seem to think of it, but a day of victory; a day of release from the chains that bind us! It is the day when we will be set free from the fear that evil creates, set free to LOVE.

I have absolute faith that day is coming!!!! IT'S FRIDAY.....BUT SUNDAY'S COMING!
